Ventura Human Trafficking Defendant Sentenced

VENTURA, Calif. - District Attorney Erik Nasarenko announced today that Alessandra Huber-Perez (DOB 9/15/01), of Ventura, was sentenced to 6 years, 4 months in state prison on Tuesday, October 18, 2022.

Huber-Perez pled guilty on August 12, 2022, to human trafficking of a minor, false imprisonment, and furnishing a controlled substance to a minor. Huber-Perez will also have to register as a sex offender.

Huber-Perez was contacted by law enforcement several times in 2021 while with the underage victim. On May 15, 2021, Huber-Perez threatened the victim with a knife and prevented her from leaving a residence in Ventura. On June 18, 2021, Huber-Perez and the victim were together again when Ventura Police Department Officers conducted a traffic stop. A search of their phones showed that Huber-Perez arranged commercial sex acts involving the victim. Cell phone records and further investigation by the Ventura County District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation showed the defendant was trafficking the underage victim.

"This case serves as a good reminder that human trafficking takes many forms," said prosecutor Rikole Kelly. "Thanks to the collaboration of the Ventura County Human Trafficking Task Force, the Ventura Police Department, and the DA's office, we were able to expose the exploitation and hold Alessandra Huber-Perez accountable."

Deputy District Attorney Rikole Kelly is a member of the District Attorney's Office Sexual Assault Unit/Human Trafficking.
