Thousand Oaks Man Arrested for Possession of Child Sexual Abuse Material

VENTURA, Calif. – District Attorney Erik Nasarenko announced today the arrest of Bronson Schreiber (DOB 04/20/95), of Thousand Oaks, for possession of child sexual abuse material. Schreiber was arrested this morning by members of the Ventura County Child Exploitation and Human Trafficking Task Force, with assistance from Simi Valley Police Department detectives.

The Task Force began investigating Schreiber in April after receiving several Cybertips from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The reports alleged Schreiber was using online cloud services to store the child abuse material that included videos of children being sexually assaulted.

Schreiber was booked into Ventura County Jail on one felony count of possession of child sexual abuse material.

"The high number of internet crimes against children is alarming," said District Attorney Chief Investigator Scott Whitney. "We are committed to investigating and prosecuting child predators."

The Task Force is comprised of investigators and prosecutors with the Ventura County District Attorney's Office, Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, Oxnard Police Department, Ventura Police Department, the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office, California Highway Patrol, the FBI, and United States Attorney's Office. The Task Force is committed to identifying, rescuing, and protecting children from sexual exploitation and abuse through education, enforcement, and through partnerships with local, state, and federal agencies.

Parents are reminded to remain vigilant as to their children's social media and internet activities to keep them safe from predators. Parents can help protect their children by educating them of the risks and dangers of online interactions with people they do not know and by teaching them

healthy internet habits. Parents are encouraged to monitor their children's internet usage and setting limits.

"Our Task Force is made up of a dedicated group of special agents, investigators, and prosecutors who are passionate about protecting children," said Supervising District Attorney Investigator Terrance Dobrosky.

The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children is a nonprofit organization dedicated to locating missing children, reduce child sexual exploitation and prevent future victimization.
